TBILISI - THE CITY THAT LOVES YOU

Tbilisi, one of Europe's oldest capitals, has been the cultural, political, and economic center of Georgia for fifteen centuries. The historic Old Tbilisi, built during the early Middle Ages, is a must-see for visitors, housing iconic sites such as the 17th-century baths and the religious diversity of Georgian Orthodox, Armenian, Catholic, and synagogues.



The Metekhi Temple, a 13th-century Georgian Orthodox Church, offers breathtaking views of the city. Mtatsminda Park offers a variety of dining options, amusement park rides, and secluded corners for relaxation. Tbilisi Modern style is characterized by its facades and painted entrance halls.



Tbilisi offers a blend of history and modern amenities, with attractions like the daily puppet presentation called The Circle of Life outside Gabriadze's Marionette Theatre.

Georgian cuisine is a unique blend of flavors, with restaurants, cafes, bars, and a dynamic nightlife. Rustaveli Avenue, the city's main thoroughfare, features historic buildings like the Parliament of Georgia, the Opera House, the National Gallery, Rustaveli Theatre, the Modern Art Museum, the National Library, and Kashveti Church. The city is also home to multiple monuments, such as the Sameba Cathedral, the Narikala Fortress, the modern Bridge of Peace, the Hall of Justice, and the President's Palace.

Location: Medical Campus, 17 Sarajishvili Street, Tbilisi, Georgia
Getting There

Metro: Take Line 1 (Akhmeteli-Varketili Line) → Exit at Sarajishvili Station

Bus: From Sarajishvili Metro, take Bus 370 or 381 to the campus. Although the immediate area around the campus doesn't have typical chain hotels and is a bit further from the city center, there are plenty of accommodation options in Tbilisi's central areas. Staying near the city center will offer you the chance to explore the capital's key locations. If you prefer using public transport, we recommend selecting a hotel near a metro station for added convenience. Feel free to choose accommodation that best suits your preferences.

Money & tipping


The official currency of Georgia is the Georgian Lari (ლ, GEL). Money can be exchanged at banks, currency exchange offices, and hotels, with banks offering the best rates. Credit cards and mobile payments are widely accepted in cities and tourist areas, but cash is still preferred in smaller businesses and remote regions. Tipping is not mandatory but is appreciated, especially in tourist spots.

Opening Hours:

Shops are usually open everyday from 10am to 10pm. There are several options for 24/7 groceries and Pharmacies. Museums usually open from 10 pm to 5:30 pm (last entry) and are closed on Mondays. Additionally, take in mind that public transport operates from 6:00AM to 00:00.

Emergencies:

In case of emergency you can call 112 to contact the fire department, ambulance or the police. You can also install the 112 app which allows you to simply tap on the ambulance, firefighter or police icon depending on what kind of help you need.
